Our state goal is for at least 90 percent of students to graduate from high school. The most current graduation rate information is for the Class of 2006, and shows:

- 86.6 Percent for the state*

ABOUT OUR STUDENTS' TEST RESULTS

2008-2009 ISAT

Reading-100% tested at 81.82% proficient

Math- 100% tested at 48.5% proficient

AYP was achieved through Safe Harbor due to a greater than 10% increase in the math proficiency goal of 70%.
